

Why should you report a crime?

It's simple: the Edmonton Police Service cannot address crimes or hotspots if they are not notified of the crimes.

Typically, when a crime occurs and is left unreported, the frequency and severity of occurrences will increase if they are not dealt with. This makes the importance of reporting crime and disorder, regardless of severity, absolutely vital for the EPS and your community

Being a good witness


So what can you do if you see a crime? Here are a few steps to follow:



- 1. If it is an emergency or a crime in progress, call 911 immediately.
- 2. Move to a safe place until police arrive.
- 3. Take note of the appearance of the people involved, including their: Age and gender Ethnicity and build Height and weight Hair colour and length Face shape and/or facial hair Eye colour and shape Clothing type and colour Anything else distinct about them
- 4. Take note of the environment around the incident: •Time Location <u>Nearby vehicles</u>, including:
 •Year, make and model Colour License plate number Number of occupants Body damage, bumper stickers or decals Direction of travel Which street it was parked/driving along when you last saw it
- 5. Take note of what happened: How many people were involved What they did and to whom
 - What was said (if you can safely hear) How they left the scene What direction were they traveling
- 6. Report what you noted to police.

Never underestimate the power of the information you have. Something as simple as reporting a suspicious person running down the street, or part of the license plate and colour of a vehicle driving around in your neighbourhood could be the missing piece needed to solve a crime.


Do you Remember When...







Prínce Charles' Infrastructure Construction Update

At the last Prince Charles Community League monthly meeting, city official Matt Mohr addressed those attending with an update about the ongoing Prince Charles neighbourhood infrastructure construction (streets, curbs, sidewalks & boulevards). He detailed the project's aims, present situation, deadlines and expectations. The following six items are a summary of his report. For more information, he provided a website and contact information for subsequent inquiries (see below).


- 1. Construction is set to start Early May
- 2. The Landscaping from last year has NOT been inspected or accepted as complete by the COE
- 3. The SOD that was placed last year and did not have a chance to germinate before hibernation. We will be assessing the SOD once its been watered and had a chance to germinate (typically 3 months).
- 4. All construction contractually is required to be complete by Oct 12 of this year (including all landscaping)
- 5. The contractor only has 123, 122, 121A streets to complete from 119ave to 123ave as well as the closure at 124st up to yellow head trail
- 6. A construction bulletin will be delivered by both the contractor Standard General and the COE which provided contact information for inquiries.


