



**Neighbourhood Watch: Basics** 


Our main objective is to have as many residents as possible actively participating in their neighbourhood so that any threats to the area will be reported to the police, thus avoiding the occurrence of a crime. We encourage residents to watch out for each other to reduce crime in the city. Edmonton Neighbourhood Watch members are the eyes and ears of the community and our members report any suspicious activity in their neighbourhoods, whenever they occur. We are always vigilant.

The Edmonton Neighbourhood Watch Program is based on volunteers. The strength of the program is based on the efforts of our members in each neighbourhood. Our volunteers include the executive, special committees, and community members. The volunteers that work within each of our neighbourhoods and the community leagues are our most important members. The program would not exist if it were not for the dedicated efforts of our volunteers.




