
Prince Charles Community League's Annual General Meeting and Election of the Board

Trailers:



- Store trailer in a locked garage if possible.
- If the trailer is stored at home or a business, put it in the back or side yard out of sight.
- Store it with the trailer tongue not easily accessible.
- If storing in an open driveway or yard, park another vehicle or other large object in front of the trailer.
- Consider removing one trailer wheel.
- Secure the trailer to an anchored object with a good quality chain and lock.
- Purchase a good quality trailer hitch lock or wheel lock and use it even if stored inside.
- Photograph your trailer, including identifying features and store your photos for future reference.
- Install a vehicle tracker. Trackers are small, quick and easy to install. Tracking units can deter thieves if advertised.
- Add one or two easily identifiable markings in different places on your trailer such as:
- welding your initials under the draw bar.
- engraving your name somewhere.
- drill holes in a pattern recognisable by you.

Edmonton Cenotaph

"The Edmonton Cenotaph represents the tombs of approximately 3,000 veterans from the Edmonton area who made the supreme sacrifice as members of the Canadian Forces in WWI", stated A.E. Nightingale in his tribute to the Cenotaph in the 1940 Year Book of the Canadian Corps Association. Mr. Nightingale points out that the Cenotaph has an interesting and peculiarly unique design. It was erected during the brief reign of King Edward VIII and unveiled on August 13th, 1936, by Lord Tweedsmuir, then Governor General of Canada, 22 years following the outbreak of WWI.






