

The only exceptions are **Christmas Day** (December 25) and **New Year's Day** (January 1). **Garbage** and blue bags must be out by 7 A.M. Do not set your containers or waste out before 4 P.M the day before pickup!

- STAY SAFE!
 Halloween Safety Tips
 - 1. Children should be accompanied by an adult
- Halloween Safety Tips

 2. Children should wear clothing that can easily be seen at night. Retro-reflective materials are best.
 - 3. Children should trick or treat in one well-known area and not wander into unknown neighbourhoods.
 - 4. All candy should be inspected by an adult to make sure that no one has tampered with it. If it looks suspicious, the police should be contacted.
 - 5. Children should avoid stray animals.
 - 6. Children should wear masks that do not interfere with vision. Better yet, they can avoid masks by wearing makeup.
 - 7. Children should watch for moving vehicles when crossing streets.
 - 8. Costumes should be short enough that the child will not trip.
 - 9. Trick or treaters should dress appropriately for the weather and carry flashlights.
 - 10. For extra safety, organize a Halloween party for children in your neighbourhood.

So what's the <u>number one</u> type of criminal activity that increases on Halloween?

PROPERTY CRIME!

And while vandalism is indeed common, 60% of these claims involved theft from the home, including breaking and entering, whether you're there or not.

What can you do about it?



IF YOU LEAVE THE HOUSE. LEAVE THE LIGHTS ON!

- Keep your doors and windows locked, even when you're home. It's easy to forget to lock your door after you've just finished handing candy out to a group of little monsters. But that also makes it just as easy for a burglar to slip in when you've stepped away later.
- Move valuables out of sight. If trick or treaters can spot your flat-screen TV from your doorway, so can a burglar.
- Don't post on social media until you're back. As cute as your kids or pets might be in their costumes, posting a picture on Facebook of them at a party across town lets criminals know your house is empty... AND a prime target.


