The Standard of a "Clean" Sidewalk

The expectation is that all snow and ice be cleared to the cement/asphalt for the entire width and length of the sidewalk. Sand, gravel and/or ice melt can be laid as a temporary measure while the snow and ice is being removed.



Timeframe to Clear a Sidewalk from a Snowfall

The Community Standards Bylaw #14600 does not provide a timeframe for snow removal. The bylaw states "A person shall maintain any sidewalk adjacent to land they own or occupy clear of all snow and ice". Snow and ice is to be removed from the sidewalks as quickly as possible.

EFCL Residential Speeds Review Update:

City Council has directed Administration to consider:

A city-wide default speed limit of 40 km/h on both local residential and collector roadways

A default speed limit of 30 km/h on local residential roadways in high density neighbourhoods located in central Edmonton, which is being referred to as the Core Zone

Administration will return to City Council in February 2020 to present different scenarios for neighbourhood speed reductions, based on the above direction from Council.

Prince Charles' NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH



Over the last year I have heard from many people that they do not report minor crimes or property crimes. A lot of people think that the only reason to call the police is to get a police response to “that” crime. However, reporting crimes is important for a few reasons.

The reason to report a crime is not just to catch a perpetrator or to get the police to solve that crime. Sometimes nothing can be done about a crime which already occurred, however the information gathered about that crime may be able to help police predict or anticipate future criminal behaviour and activity. Police forces across North America use statistical analysis as one tool in helping to solve and prevent crime. Members of the community can help in many ways. The most productive is to practice crime prevention strategies (become a hard target for crime). But, if you become a victim of any type of crime – **REPORT IT**. When crimes are reported that data can be analyzed by the police to anticipate where and even when crimes may happen. The more data, the better chance of catching the criminals. What if your neighbourhood recently had several incidents of car thefts and you saw someone pulling the door handles along your street. Without the initial reports neither you nor the police would know to watch for suspicious activities. But knowing about the recent crime, would you be more likely to report that suspicious person? Would the police be more likely to respond knowing of the recent increase in crime in that area?

By reporting crimes, we can help EPS identify if a crime wave is in a neighbourhood. The police only know about spikes in crimes if crimes are reported. By reporting we can provide more information to the police. The more information that is received the more accurately and quickly they can identify and apprehend the suspects. So, if you are victim of a crime **REPORT IT!**

The EPS has made it very easy to report a crime. You can report crimes such as: [Damage to Property](#), [Damage to Vehicle](#), [Lost Property](#), [Theft from Vehicle under \\$5,000](#) or [Theft under \\$5,000](#).

Skills required include listening, writing, accurate recording,

understanding the information, checking for accuracy.

Responsibilities include













- Prepare the agenda for the next meeting. This usually happens after information is gathered from all members about what they want.
- Formal and accurate records are kept of what is discussed and decided at each of the meetings. This is referred to as taking the 'minutes'.
- The mail for the Club comes to the secretary who then passes it to the other members or takes it to the meetings to be 'tabled'
- Records of the Club need to be kept. This could include a list of all the members, previous committee members, previous decisions that have been made. Any correspondence that has been received that gives information or is related to important decisions is also kept. Important historical records may also be kept and held in a safe place by the secretary.

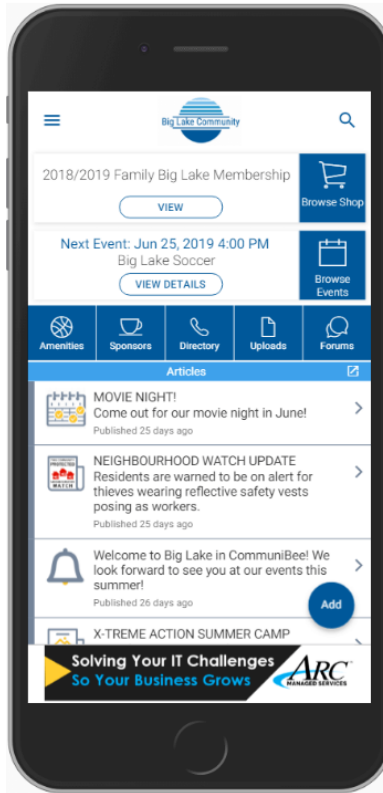

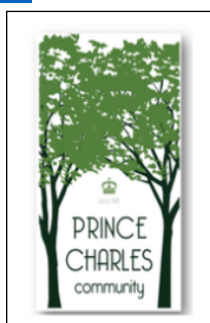
