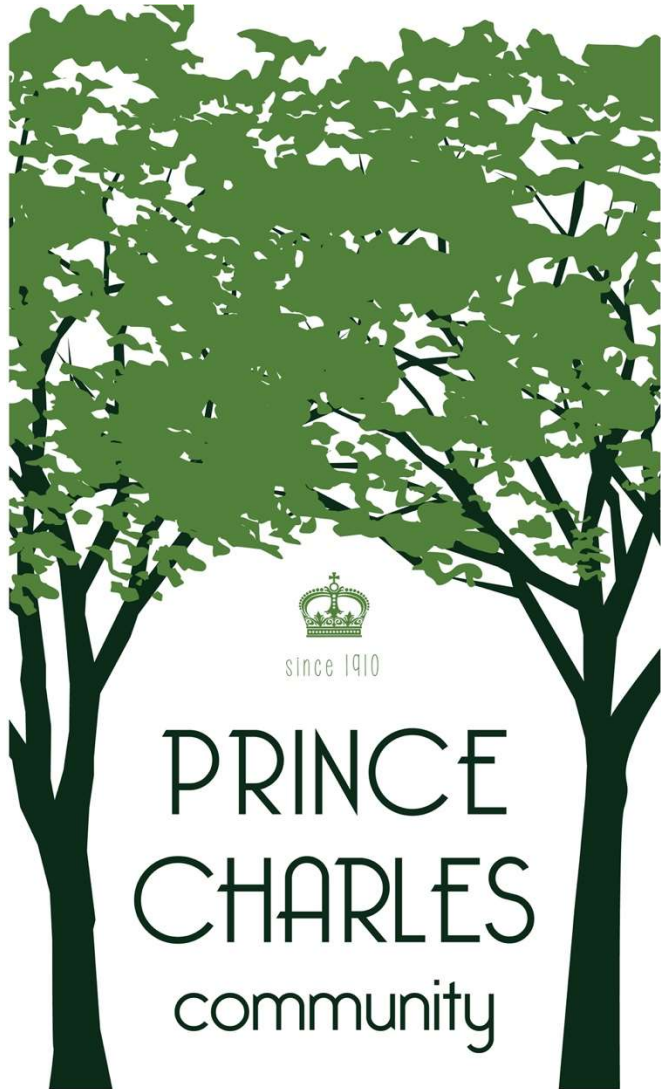

# WHY SHOULD YOU REPORT A CRIME?

It's simple! The Edmonton Police Service cannot address crimes or hotspots if they're not notified of crimes.

Typically, when a crime occurs and is left unreported, the frequency and severity of occurrences will increase if they are not dealt with. **This makes the importance of reporting crime and disorder, regardless of severity, absolutely vital for the EPS and your community.**



## ***Be a good witness!***

So what can you do if you see a crime? Here are a few steps to follow:

1. If it is an emergency or a crime in progress – immediately **call 9-1-1**.
2. Move to a safe place until police arrive.
3. Take note of the appearance of people involved, including their:
  - Age and gender
  - Ethnicity and build
  - Height and weight
  - Hair colour and length
  - Face shape and/or facial hair
  - Eye colour and shape
  - Clothing type and colour
  - Anything else distinct



4. Take note of the environment around the incident, including the time and location. Make note of nearby vehicles, looking for:

Year	Colour
Make and Model	License Plate
Number of Occupants	Body damage
Bumper stickers	What street
Direction of travel	



5. Take note of what happened:
  - How many people were involved?
  - What did they do (and to whom)
  - What was said (if you could safely hear)
  - How they left the location

6. **Report what you noted to police!**

# Attention Residents of Prince Charles

The Prince Charles Park Committee would like to provide an update on what has been happening with the park since the last survey. While we had been looking to replace the sand with a rubber surface, unforeseen obstacles, including the age of the playground and unanticipated costs, have forced the committee and the league to consider the second choice of engineered wood fibre.

The reasons for this are numerous. In addition to the cost of the rubber surface, it was determined that playground equipment would need to be raised and repositioned at an unknown cost, a large tree is present in the northeast corner of the playground around which the rubber cannot be poured, and it was found that the playground equipment will likely need replacing in approximately 12 years, while the rubber surface has a lifespan of 20 years. In addition to the resurfacing, we are also pursuing other improvements to the park that the community has indicated a desire for, including levelling the basketball court, adding seating to the gazebo, and improved lighting.

Given the cost and challenges, it is the committee's opinion and the PCCL boards decision that implementing the rubber surface at this time may not be in the best interest of the community. Choosing Engineered Wood Fibre will keep our project within budget, and allow us to pursue both resurfacing and other park improvements.
